This map of Rome depicts the ancient Roman architecture of the city, with place names labeled to the left and right. It is highly detailed. Ancient Roman architecture refers to an architectural style created by the Romans and spread across their territory along the Mediterranean Sea. It is often referred to simply as Roman architecture. It directly incorporated the achievements of late Greek architecture, while greatly advancing it, becoming the most advanced architectural form in the 1st to 3rd centuries. In the Western academic tradition, the term refers to the architecture of the Roman

Republic and the Roman Empire. Some of the buildings depicted in this map are no longer standing, including many arches, palaces and large plazas. The city was full of beautiful works of historic architecture, plazas, fountains and monuments.
